Dear Asia Dengue Policy Working Group Members,

As we approach the end of 2025, we are pleased to share key milestones and upcoming activities for the Asia Dengue Policy Working Group (ADPWG). Building on the strong foundation laid over the past two years, the ADPWG continues to convene regional experts, strengthen collaboration, and drive practical strategies in support of the WHO goal of Zero Dengue Deaths by 2030.

A key highlight this quarter was the regional roundtable, “Scaling Integrated Dengue Prevention Programmes in Asia by 2030”, held on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2025. A summary of the event can be found below. Looking ahead, we are excited to launch a series of ADPWG webinars aimed at deepening cross-country learning. The first session, focused on Sri Lanka’s Dengue Management System, will take place on 5<sup>th</sup> December 2025, highlighting Sri Lanka’s best practices in surveillance, prevention, and outbreak response. Additional sessions featuring the Singapore Red Cross (February 2026) are planned, with further details to be shared at a later date. Lastly, the ADPWG is also delighted to announce that its Membership Directory will be launched in January 2026 in hopes of serving as a platform to facilitate partnerships and encourage collaboration.

We hope this update provides a useful overview of our recent achievements and the activities ahead. As always, we welcome your ideas, feedback, and continued partnership as we work together to accelerate progress toward Zero Dengue Deaths by 2030.

KEY MILESTONES

Roundtable: Scaling Integrated Dengue Prevention Programmes in Asia by 2030

On 11<sup>th</sup> October 2025, the ADPWG convened a regional roundtable with dengue experts from Indonesia, the Philippines, Malaysia, and Sri Lanka to discuss integrated prevention strategies, community engagement, and policy-level actions. Countries shared updates from their national programmes, including Indonesia’s Fight Dengue Joint Coalition (KOBAR) initiative, the Philippines’ Empowering Networks to Defeat Dengue (END) coalition and its planned pilot Wolbachia-release programme, Malaysia’s Dengue Prevention Advocacy Malaysia (DPAM) efforts, and Sri Lanka’s advances in clinical management and regional training.

Despite ongoing progress, common gaps persist in surveillance, sustaining community engagement – particularly among younger generations – and improving vaccine awareness and uptake. To advance toward the goal of Zero Dengue Deaths by 2030, participants highlighted the need to:

- Strengthen regional advocacy
- Refresh behavioural models and communication strategies for younger audiences
- Leverage digital platforms for broader outreach, enhance vaccine awareness and acceptance
- Establish regular cross-country knowledge-sharing forums
